School Leaders,

Good morning from the Department of Dine Education. The Navajo Nation President, Honorable Jonathan Nez, has assembled a team consisting of Navajo Nation Division Directors, Indian Health Service leaders, and Navajo Nation 638 Hospital leaders to address the coronavirus (COVID-19) epidemic happening throughout the world, with specific focus on the Navajo Nation. We are serving on the Navajo Nation's COVID-19 preparation team. There are no confirmed cases on the Navajo Nation as of this date. We pray that coronavirus NEVER comes within the sacred mountains and land of the Dine people.

The Department of Dine Education is a member of this team with the focus on all schools located on the Navajo Nation. This includes all State Public, Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIE) funded, Tribally Controlled, Mission, and Private Schools, and Navajo Nation Head Start Centers. This letter serves as an announcement to your school and community that information on COVID-19 we have gathered from the U.S. Department of Education and Interior, State Departments of Education from Arizona, New Mexico, and Utah, and the BIE that informs the schools, teachers, parents, and community members of the preventative measures regarding the coronavirus (COVID-19). Much of the information has already been disseminated to schools and the general public. We have compiled this information on our DODE website for your access at the address listed below.
